<p>Job Purpose: To operate the plant</p> <p>Duties:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn and operate all processes associated with the ethanol production plant • Learn and operate DCS (computer control system) for the plant • Follow standard operating procedures for plant start-up, shut down, cleaning, batching and operations • Do quality control tests on product streams; record/input results accurately and appropriately • Respond to collected data and make adjustment to optimize plant operation • Keep plant facilities clean using shovels, brooms, squeegees, etc. • Keep operators coming on shift briefed on what has happened and what is supposed to be done during the next shift • Responsible for notifying Plant Shift Supervisor of any production problems • Complete any and all tasks assigned by the Plant Shift Supervisor and Production Manager • Work closely and communicate with other departments (lab, maintenance, shipping/receiving) • Comply with all safety, environmental and other regulatory compliance programs and procedures.
